



NATIONAL COMMITTEE ON YOUTH GUIDANCE AND REHABILITATION (NYGR) FUND ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES

1. Organisations **MUST** fulfil all the basic criteria to be eligible for the NYGR Fund.

<u>BASIC CRITERIA (C1-4)</u>	
C1	<p>The project should be initiated and implemented by a non-profit organisation (NPO).</p> <p>For individuals who wish to apply for the NYGR Fund, the project must be fronted and endorsed by a NPO.</p>
C2	<p>The project must be beneficial to the following target group(s):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Youth at-risk (YAR) ii. Juvenile delinquents iii. Youth (ex) offenders iv. Youth/social workers who work with at-risk/delinquent youth <p>For projects on creating public awareness about YAR issues, target group can include general public, mainstream youth, parents and educators.</p>
C3	<p>Project content/message should not be offensive or carry any racial, political or religious implications.</p>
C4	<p>The project must be organised on a cost-sharing basis. In general, the NYGR Fund should not exceed 50% of total project budget submitted.</p> <p>Project cannot profit from the NYGR Fund and other government funding sources. The project can only receive up to 70% funding from government bodies (including the NYGR Fund).</p>

2. Organisations are encouraged to also have one or more of the following additional criteria in their projects.

<u>ADDITIONAL CRITERIA (C5-8)</u>	
C5	<p>Innovativeness</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - New initiative in Singapore to meet emerging youth issue or address gap - Repeated project requires new programme element

C6	<p>Sustainability</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Project is on-going and is not a one-time off event - Project has plans to have subsequent runs in near future
C7	<p>Impact</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Large-scale project with high impact/outreach. Considerations should be given to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Number of youths in the organising committee or project team • Number of participants or beneficiaries • Duration of the project
C8	<p>Project Plan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Incorporate service-learning/community-service element - Programme design based on research - Plan for proper and in depth programme evaluation to be carried out

3. Organisations need to take note of the following guidelines/instructions:

- (i) Audits will be randomly conducted.
- (ii) Fund-raising projects are not supported.
- (iii) The project report must be submitted within two months of the project's completion, otherwise the remaining grant will be forfeited. A one-month extension can be considered upon request at least five working days before the submission deadline.

Future applications by the same applicant organisation would only be considered upon satisfactory submission of all required documents for projects with previous grants.

- (iv) Each organisation can only receive up to \$30,000 per financial year.
